Deleting an object is different from hiding it.

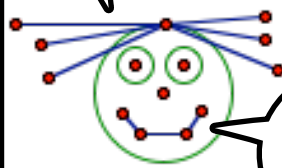

Delete Objects



Suppose you start to draw a face.

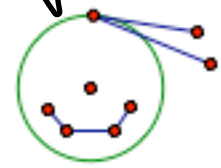
You draw hair and eyes...



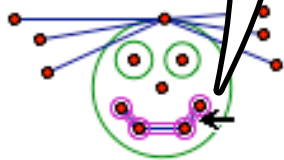
but then decide to change the mouth.

You could choose **Edit | Undo** several times...

but you'll lose your most recent actions.



Instead, select the mouth...



Edit

and choose **Edit | Clear Objects** to delete it...

or press the Delete or Backspace key.

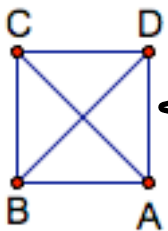

Now, draw a new mouth.

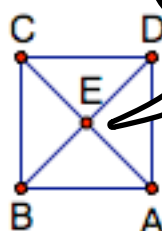


Hide Objects



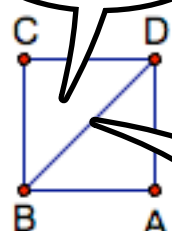
Suppose you draw diagonals to make the center of a square.

The center is the intersection of the diagonals.

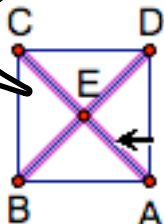


If you delete a diagonal...

the center goes away!



Instead, select the two diagonals...



Display

Point Style

Line Style

Color

Text

Hide Segments

Show All Hidden

and choose **Display | Hide Segments**.

Ctrl+H

The center stays.
